MONTHLY REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 2011

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1363 law incidents for the month, issued 85 infractions, 48 criminal traffic citations, 22 criminal citations, 19 parking infractions and made 144 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled, 70 "animal problem" complaints, 32 abandoned vehicles, 4 code enforcement issues and 6 parking complaints. A total of 28 animals were impounded.
- WEEKEND JAIL SESSION #10-11: The department conducted the tenth and eleventh weekend jail sessions of 2011 starting on October 29, 2011 through court on Tuesday, November 8th. The original October weekend was preempted by a jury trial. Since the weekend sessions were back-to-back, the department kept the jail open all week. A total of 57 prisoners were booked into the City Jail at the police station (40 male/ 17 female). Three inmates were court commitment sentences where the defendant was able to serve his or her time here instead of at a contract jail facility. Twelve inmates were the result of new arrests/ charges. A total of 19 prisoners posted \$24,350 in bail. By court on Tuesday, ten defendants were held in continued custody and transported to the contract jail facility (Forks PD) for further proceedings. Four additional defendants surrendered to the court on Tuesday. A total of 77 warrants were cleared by arrest during this extended warrant sweep session. Given the success of this event, additional back-to-back sessions will likely be scheduled in 2012.
- On November 2, 2011 at 1930 hours, officers were dispatched to the 600 block of 8th Street for a reported robbery at an apartment. Apparently two masked males entered the apartment, one armed with a black colored handgun. The suspects demanded the victims turn over their safe in which the victims stored their prescription pain medication. The victims complied and the suspects left with the safe. The next day, a black colored, realistic-looking air pistol was recovered from a flowerbed near the scene; a black cloth mask was recovered a block away. Suspect information has been developed and the case is under investigation.
- Officers were dispatched to a welfare check on November 4, 2011 at 2031 hours in the 600 block of Bayview Ave in regard to a 31-year old Aberdeen man acting strangely. The resident reported his friend showed up at his house and his friend was "losing his mind". Officers spoke with the disturbed man and convinced him to go to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. The officers transported him (with the dome light on as he was afraid of darkness) and remained until the subject was treated and evaluated by hospital staff. The next day, the sheriff's department was advised of an unreported homicide in Humptulips which tied back to the man from the prior evening. Hoquiam officers detained the suspect, who had spent the night at the Crisis Clinic, and turned him over to the sheriff's office. At the time of the first contact, Hoquiam officers had no idea the man had earlier attacked an elderly couple in Humptulips and allegedly left them for dead before taking their pick-up and driving to town.

- On November 7, 2011 at 1918 hours, officers investigated a vehicle prowling in the 2300 block of Sumner Ave. Approximately one hour later, Officer McCartney spotted two male subjects in an alley carrying a spotlight described as stolen earlier. Officer McCartney talked to the two males, both with a known drug and theft history, until the vehicle prowling victim could respond to look at the spotlight. The victim determined it was stolen and the 20 and 22-year old Hoquiam men were arrested. Additional stolen property was recovered from their persons in addition to a realistic-looking BB pistol being carried by one suspect in his waistband. They were booked at the county jail for drug, vehicle prowling and possession of stolen property charges.
- Officers responded to a business in the 700 block of J Street on November 8, 2011 at 1755 hours regarding a disorderly 54-year old transient with mental health issues. The man was trespassed from the business and advised to leave. He demanded a ride from each officer- who all politely declined. Instead of walking away, the suspect suddenly turned and slapped Officer Blodgett across the face with an open hand. The suspect was subdued by the three officers present; he was subsequently booked at the county jail for assault and resisting arrest.
- On November 10, 2011 at 1910 hours, officers learned a 13-year old runaway girl from Aberdeen was with a 35-year old Hoquiam man at his home in the 300 block of N Street. Officers discovered both present with beer in the man's bedroom; the man was arrested for furnishing alcohol to a minor. Detectives were called-in to investigate allegations the man had sexual contact with the girl after befriending her on Facebook. After interviewing both, the man was booked at the county jail for rape of a child in the second degree.
- During the course of investigating an assault at the end of a wedding reception on November 12, 2011 at 0130 hours, Officers stopped a vehicle in the 3100 block of Port Industrial Way being driven from the scene by the reported suspect. When an officer attempted to arrest the 23-year old Aberdeen man, the officer was able to get only one handcuff on before the suspect started to fight. The officer took the suspect to the ground, but the man rolled onto his back and kicked the officer in the side of the head with his pointed cowboy boot. An additional arriving Hoquiam officer and two Aberdeen officers attempted to get control of the suspect as he continued to punch, kick and grab an officer by the duty belt. The suspect was subsequently booked at the county jail for two counts of assault in the 3rd degree of a law enforcement officer. One Hoquiam officer sustained an arm injury and was off-work for several days; the other officer sustained an injury to his leg from being kicked. Immigration and Customs Enforcement later detained the suspect on a federal hold.
- On November 20, 2011 at 0030 hours, officers responded to the area of Grays Harbor Paper for suspicious circumstances. The mill's security guard reported seeing someone with a flashlight along the nearby railroad trestle and swing-bridge over the Hoquiam River. Officers located two Hoquiam men hiding nearby, ages 25 and 26, in possession of burglary tools and freshly stripped copper wire taken from the train trestle. The suspects were booked at the county jail for trespassing and theft; Judge Stewart later set bail at \$25,000/each given the potential disruption and safety issues related to the railroad line.
- Graveyard officers were dispatched to a reported fight at a gas station in the 200 block of Lincoln Street on November 22, 2011 at 2200 hours. An intoxicated 22-year old Hoquiam man confronted a motorist from Port Angeles and his passengers for no apparent reason. The victims became alarmed by not only the suspect's behavior, but also the fact he had a pistol in a holster on his belt; the suspect apparently reached toward the gun several times. As officers arrived at the scene, Sgt. Salstrom recognized he had the opportunity to slide up behind the suspect and take the gun from the suspect's holster. The suspect was so engaged in yelling and

waving his arms, he did not even realize Sgt. Salstrom had stripped him of the firearm. The suspect resisted arrest and had to be taken to the ground for handcuffing. He was booked for assault 4th degree, disorderly conduct and unlawful display of a weapon. The city intends to forfeit the pistol and the suspect's concealed pistol license as he was intoxicated at the time of the incident.

- On the evening of Thanksgiving, November 24, 2011 at 1730 hours, officers arrested a 17-year old Hoquiam boy in the 500 block of 10th Street after he became upset because his cellular phone service had been turned off and he could no longer talk to his girlfriend. Upon the arrival of officers, family members were trying to restrain the youth in the driveway of the home after he also demanded to take the family car (even though he had no license). The suspect was booked at the juvenile detention center for assault 4th degree- domestic violence.
- Officer Hergert was on patrol in the 400 block of 31st Street at around 0110 hours on November 27, 2011 when he observed a car in a nearby alley. The vehicle suddenly accelerated at a high rate of speed westbound down the alley away from the patrol car. Officer Hergert attempted to give chase as the suspect traversed alleys and side streets at speeds so fast the vehicle jumped the crown of the street in a shower of sparks. Officer Hergert was able to get the vehicle stopped in the 200 block of 29th Street, whereupon he arrested the 21-year old Aberdeen man for felony eluding, driving under the influence and driving with a suspended license.
- On November 29, 2011 at 1153 hours, officers were dispatched to an unlawful display of a knife near 8th and Simpson Avenue. Two males along the street apparently got into some sort of verbal argument until one pulled out a large folding knife. The 32-year old Hoquiam suspect was last observed going into Behavioral Health Resources in the 200 block of 8th Street- where he was contacted by officers. As the officers attempted to secure the suspect and make sure he could not again pull a knife, the suspect started to resist and struggle with the two patrol officers and Chief Myers. The suspect was finally wrestled down onto the sidewalk after falling out the front door during the struggle. The knife was recovered buried under some bark in a nearby city tree well. Officers later learned the 5-10, 260 pound registered sex offender suffers from paranoid schizophrenia, was not taking his medications or cooperating with his counselor and was using methamphetamine.
- Officers responded to a reported domestic violence assault in the 3000 block of Sumner Avenue on November 29, 2011 at 2152 hours. The reporting party heard a physical fight and the sounds of items breaking; upon the arrival of the officers however, all was quiet and no one would answer the door. Officers found the door unlocked and entered the premises to check for victim(s). Officers located a male and female inside, both intoxicated, as well as the room in disarray- including a broken flat screen television. As they interviewed the residents, they located an intoxicated 28-year old Hoquiam man hiding in a closet. Officers subsequently arrested the 28-year old after they determined he had assaulted and choked his mother's boyfriend almost to the point of unconsciousness. The suspect was booked at the county jail for felony assault in the second degree (choking) under the domestic violence act.

BUDGET:

- For the month of November, **167 hours** of overtime was expended as listed below. It should be noted that overtime has increased given the vacant police officer position and a patrol sergeant who is currently on light-duty covering administrative duties left by the open deputy chief position. For the month, the department was short two officers in the Patrol Division:

PERSONNEL:

- Officer David Blundred, who was hired as a lateral officer from the sheriff's department, completed his 2nd year with the city as of November 23rd; Sgt. Joe Strong completed his 17th year with the department as of November 28th.
- Chief Myers attended the fall conference of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC). As the chairman of the state's Criminal Justice Training Commission, he worked with WASPC to address a cost-shift from the state to local agencies as proposed under the governor's supplemental budget. All mandated state criminal justice training (created in 1974) had previously been covered by a dedicated fee and account added to all traffic tickets. The Public Safety Education Account (PSEA) was rolled into the state general fund during the prior biennium to boost the state's bond limit. The current proposal would require local jurisdictions to pay for 50% of all mandated state training and overhead costs, including the Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA) and the Corrections Officer Academy (COA)- even though the traffic fines continue to be collected. WASPC and other groups plan to oppose this change.
- Detective Sergeant Krohn and Detective Gaddis attended the annual Violent Crimes Conference held at the academy. The training covered several recent high-profile crimes and investigations, including the murder of Seattle PD Officer Tim Brenton, who ironically started his career in Hoquiam.

FACILITIES/ EQUIPMENT:

- Several recent expensive repairs on the 2007 Ford Crown Victoria patrol vehicles (specifically vehicle #309) illustrated the need to maintain a regular vehicle replacement rotation. This vehicle is scheduled to be replaced in 2012 with funds accrued in the police department's Equipment Rental and Reserve Fund (ER&R).

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month of November, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 113.25 hours of service- including 91.75 hours on residential patrols, 0.5 office hours and 21 other hours, to include security at HHS football games.
- The youth Police Explorers, under the direction of Officer David Blundred, contributed 168 hours of time to the department, to include meetings, ride-alongs with officers and working special details. To date, the Explorers have donated a total of 1050 hours to the department.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:


The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month of November 2011. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Ave. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases that were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
