## *MONTHLY REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2011*

### POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1366 law incidents for the month, issued 91 infractions, 44 criminal traffic citations, 25 criminal citations, 15 parking infractions and made 154 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled, 67 "animal problem" complaints, 16 abandoned vehicles, 4 code enforcement issues and 5 parking complaints. A total of 23 animals were impounded.
- WEEKEND JAIL SESSION #10-11: The department conducted the tenth and eleventh weekend jail sessions of 2011 starting on October 29, 2011 through court on Tuesday, November 8th. The original October weekend was preempted by a jury trial. Since the weekend sessions were back-to-back, the department kept the jail open all week. A total of 57 prisoners were booked into the City Jail at the police station (40 male/ 17 female). Three inmates were court commitment sentences where the defendant was able to serve his or her time here instead of at a contract jail facility. Twelve inmates were the result of new arrests/ charges. A total of 19 prisoners posted \$24,350 in bail. By court on Tuesday, ten defendants were held in continued custody and transported to the contract jail facility (Forks PD) for further proceedings. Four additional defendants surrendered to the court on Tuesday. A total of 77 warrants were cleared by arrest during this extended warrant sweep session.
- On October 5, 2011 at approximately 2157 hours, Hoquiam officers started investigating a felony harassment complaint (threats to kill) against a female by her 34-year old ex-boyfriend in the 2900 block of Aberdeen Avenue. Officers attempted to contact the suspect (who was known to have mental health issues and own a pistol) at his residence; the suspect answered the door but quickly closed the door in the officer's face. As the officers were preparing to leave, the suspect emerged from his house and pointed a pistol at two of the officers. The officers ordered the suspect to drop the weapon, at which point he retreated inside- leading to a 7½ hour armed standoff. Additional Hoquiam officers were called in, as well as units from Aberdeen PD, Grays Harbor Sheriff's Office and the State Patrol. Containment was established and the immediate neighbors were evacuated to an awaiting Grays Harbor Transit bus. Hoquiam Fire Department paramedics stood-by. Department negotiators communicated with the suspect for over five hours via text-messaging (he refused to talk on the phone) as Aberdeen PD deployed their SWAT officers. The suspect surrendered at 1047 hours after SWAT shot out a bedroom window with a less-lethal rubber-tipped projectile. The suspect was booked for felony assault and felony harassment; a search warrant served at the home recovered the pistol. The department utilized the Special Operations Vehicle at the scene as a command post. During the entire operation, 14 of the 17 sworn members of the department were deployed at some point. The incident was brought to a safe resolution because of the professional actions of all the officers from the departments involved- especially Aberdeen PD, which committed significant resources and manpower for containment, investigations and SWAT.

- On October 21, 2011 at 1421 hours, Hoquiam officers responded to 920 Anderson Drive to assist Aberdeen PD with a shooting outside of Grays Harbor Health and Rehabilitation. A county prisoner escaped on foot from nearby Community Hospital with a county corrections officer in close pursuit. Upon entering the parking lot, the suspect grabbed a female employee by the neck and threatened to kill her with a small, sharp object held to her throat. After the suspect refused orders to release the woman, the corrections officer shot the suspect; the suspect was later pronounced dead at the hospital. Hoquiam units arrived quickly at the scene as all other Aberdeen PD units were on other details at the time. Hoquiam officers assisted with securing the shooting scene as well as covering patrol calls in Aberdeen. During the course of the investigation, Det. Sgt. Krohn assisted with interviewing witnesses and the Special Operations Vehicle was brought to the scene because of the heavy rain. Additional Hoquiam officers were called-in to measure the entire outdoor scene with the 'total station' surveying device. Sgt. Strong created several scale diagrams of the scene, to include a three-dimensional view, which was forwarded to Aberdeen for their case file.
- Just after 0600 hours on October 22, 2011, officers were dispatched to Swanson's Supermarket for a shoplifting complaint. Store employees watched a heavy-set female take an entire hand basket of merchandise into the bathroom, apparently stash the goods on her person and then start to leave the store. Employees confronted the female and locked her inside as they called 911. As officers arrived, the suspect charged a female employee and struck her. The suspect was arrested with almost \$200 worth of merchandise recovered from the suspect's clothing-including a bottle of wine stuffed down her bra. The female was booked at the county jail for robbery as she had used force against the store employee. The suspect was well known to officers and has a history of mental health issues and drug abuse.
- Later in the day on October 22, 2011 at 1400 hours, officers were dispatched to an apartment complex in the 600 block of 7<sup>th</sup> Street for a male resident causing a disturbance and threatening to kill other tenants. Once the suspect saw the officers, he ran into his apartment and taunted officers as they tried to talk with him through the window. As officers collected written statements from other residents, the suspect came out of his apartment and once again threatened to kill another tenant. Officers confronted the suspect and took him to the ground when he walked toward an officer and refused to stop. The suspect resisted arrest and a Taser was deployed to gain control for handcuffing. As the suspect was being transported to the county jail for booking, he started slamming his head against the prisoner screen. He was transported back to the city jail where he was restrained in the jail restraint chair until he calmed down. The subject appeared to be suffering from mental health issues and drug abuse. He was later booked at the county jail.
- In the evening of October 22, 2011 at 1913 hours, officers were advised of a vehicle stuck in the mud near the end of Beacon Hill. During the course of talking to the driver, officers noticed he was nervous and claimed the truck belonged to his boss. A registration check of the vehicle disclosed it was actually listed as stolen out of Shelton. The vehicle was impounded and the 30-year old Hoquiam man was booked at the county jail for vehicle theft.
- Officers responded to the area of 5<sup>th</sup> and L Street at 0009 hours on October 23, 2011 for a suspicious person walking around dressed in all black clothing. The suspicious male told a citizen "you didn't see anything" and walked away. Officers located the 22-year old transient, who was a known thief and drug abuser, inside of a vehicle nearby. When confronted, he told officers he was "vehicle prowler". Stolen items were recovered from the car as well as

speakers taken in another vehicle prowling two blocks away. The suspect was cited and released for two counts of vehicle prowling, malicious mischief and possession of drug paraphernalia.

- On October 24, 2011 at 1318 hours, Officer McCartney was in the 2700 block of Cherry Street when he noticed a vehicle with Oregon plates parked near a known drug house. A check of the plate revealed the vehicle was listed as stolen out of Aberdeen. As Officer McCartney checked the area, he was contacted by a witness who saw a male and female exit the stolen car and walk into the drug house. Officers and detectives established surveillance of the house and car, hoping the occupants would return. Apparently the suspects saw one of the marked patrol cars down the street and went back into the house. Officers made contact at the house and were invited inside by the resident. Officers checked for the suspects and located the male hiding in the bottom of a small closet. The suspect refused to exit and appeared to be reaching for a weapon. He was subdued with a Taser and pulled from the closet where an open knife was recovered. The 27-year old transient refused to identify himself, but officers were able to determine he was wanted on a numerous warrants. The keys for the stolen car were found in his pocket. The male was booked for felony possession of stolen property, possession of marijuana, resisting arrest, obstructing a law enforcement officer and several warrants. His 22-year old Aberdeen female passenger was booked at the Aberdeen Jail on a warrant; she will be submitted for charges for possession of heroin pending lab results. A 26-year old resident of the home (who happened to be present) was booked at the county jail on an outstanding Hoquiam warrant.
- On October 27, 2011 at 1207 hours, officers responded to a domestic assault in the 500 block of Chenault Avenue where it was reported two juvenile males (brothers) were in an argument and one had grabbed a knife. Officers arriving at the scene could hear a physical fight inside. Upon investigation, it was determined one of the brothers had indeed swung a kitchen knife at the other, resulting in a cut to the victim's finger. The juvenile suspect was booked for assault in the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree at the county juvenile detention center.
- Officers were dispatched to a possible burglary in progress on October 27, 2011 at 0100 hours at the old Willis Enterprises facility on Mill Avenue. The company had to hire an armed guard for the location because of ongoing metal theft inside the building and yard. Officers tactically entered under darkness and watched a male and female taking metal from a shelf and placing it quietly in a bucket. Officers also noted a wheelbarrow full of heavy metal objects nearby. Officers confronted the 36-year old male and 38-year old female (both transients) in the act and booked them into the county jail for burglary 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and theft.
- On October 28, 2011 at 2205 hours, officers responded to a suspicious vehicle in the area of 100 Airport Way. A passerby reported seeing a vehicle drive onto the property of Dahlstrom's Lumber and turn off the lights. The company has a large storage yard for spare mill parts; the location has been hit several times by metal thieves in the past. Officers located around 2,000 pounds of metal parts in the bed of the truck parked on the property, but no one around. During a search of the area, officers located two suspects, a 25-year old Central Park man and a 25-year old Montesano man, hiding in the brush. The metal was identified by the mill manager and re-secured by the company. The suspects were booked into the Hoquiam Jail (warrant sweep weekend) for theft 3<sup>rd</sup> degree and criminal trespassing 2<sup>nd</sup> degree.
- A highly intoxicated male banging on a door of a home in the 300 block of Karr Avenue brought a police response on October 30, 2011 at 0026 hours. The homeowners did not know the man. The 20-year old complained to officers that he could not get into his house for some reason. Officers discovered the male was one street and one block over from his house. The male was cited for minor in consumption of liquor and transported to his actual home.

- The department participated in two school education programs during October. They included "Click it and Ticket" whereby Hoquiam HS students arriving on campus received a "good job ticket" for being properly seat belted. The tickets were later traded for prizes at an all-school assembly. Later in the month, several officers (including Det. Sgt. Krohn and Sgt. Salstrom with Canine Enno) participated in a "Red Ribbon" Assembly at Hoquiam Middle School to emphasize the danger of substance abuse.

#### BUDGET:

- For the month of October, **244.5 hours** of overtime was expended as listed below. It should be noted that overtime has increased given the vacant police officer position and a patrol sergeant who is currently on light-duty covering administrative duties left by the open deputy chief position. For the month, the department was short two officers in the Patrol Division:

#### PERSONNEL:

- For the month of October, the scheduled department in-service training was defensive tactics (DT) which concentrated on ground-fighting. The 4-hour class was taught by the department's state Master DT Instructor, Officer Cody Blodgett; it was held in the wrestling room at Hoquiam HS. Officers practiced not only hand-to-hand control techniques, but also learned how to defend themselves should they be taken to the ground. With the popularity of ultimate fighting and wrestling, coupled with all the extra weight and duty gear officers carry, this area of defensive tactics is becoming more and more important for officers on the street.
- Additional training completed for the month included sending Administrative Assistant Candi Wertanen to the LEIRA conference (Law Enforcement Information and Records Association) for courses in leadership and complying with public records requests. Several department members completed LiveScan fingerprint scanner training. PSO Kinney and Sgt. Krohn attended NIBRS training (National Incident Based Reporting System) which is due to replace the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) by 2012. Three officers attended specialized training to include dealing with violent juvenile offenders and working with confidential informants.

#### FACILITIES/ EQUIPMENT:

- Installation of the cabinetry, desk and storage benches continued during the month into the department's Special Operations Vehicle (#313). Most of the cabinets were done and were pending the arrival of stain. As noted previously, the vehicle was invaluable at the scene of the armed stand-off on Aberdeen Avenue as well as at the Aberdeen shooting investigation. The department hopes to have the vehicle in full operation before the end of next month. It is anticipated the vehicle will continue to be very valuable as a command post and crime scene unit.

- During the month, the department purchased metal racks with solid wood shelving for the evidence room. The units are intended to replace a large, homebuilt shelving unit in the middle of the room which unfortunately has slotted shelves (whereby smaller evidence items can fall to a lower shelf through the gap). The shelving should be installed before the end of the year.
- As a result of a need identified during the armed stand-off on Aberdeen Avenue, the department ordered a handheld ballistic shield for use by patrol officers. The shield will award officers with some level of protection from firearms when out in the open or when responding to an active shooter situation. The department had to borrow a shield from the sheriff's office during the stand-off in order to go door-to-door to evacuate neighbors next door to the suspect.

#### VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month of October, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 65.75 hours of service- including 37 hours on residential patrols, 3.75 office hours and 25 other hours, to include security at HHS football games, DEA Take Back Day and Haunted Hoquiam in the station lobby. During the month, CRIME WATCH was in the process of conducting background investigations on two new potential members.
- The youth Police Explorers, under the direction of Officer David Blundred, contributed 94 hours of time to the department, to include meetings, ride-alongs with officers and working special details. To date, the Explorers have donated a total of 960 hours to the department.

#### STATISTICAL REPORTS:


The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month of October 2011. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Ave. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases that were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
