MONTHLY REPORT FOR DECEMBER 2012

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1136 law incidents for the month, issued 74 infractions, 39 criminal traffic citations, 24 criminal citations, 9 parking infractions and made 172 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled 47 “animal problem” complaints, 39 abandoned vehicles, 4 code enforcement issues and 13 parking complaints. 17 animals were impounded.
- **Jail session #12** was scheduled for a four-day event, but it was decided to expand the jail opening to 10-days to accommodate DOC “Swift and Certain” violators. During the jail opening, 64 inmates were booked into the city jail on a combination of warrants, court commits and new charges. Thirteen females were arrested and 51 males. Eleven inmates were able to secure bail for their release resulting in the court collecting \$9,300 in bail. During the two court sessions an additional 15 defendants surrendered themselves to the court on outstanding warrants. 61 warrants were cleared during this jail session. During this jail session, 31 inmates booked were DOC offenders on the “Swift and Certain” program. The department was able to bill DOC for a total of \$6800. After deducting the wages for the temporary correction officers and jail food purchases the department cleared just over \$2000.
- **On 12-15-12** at about 0700 hours, Hoquiam Officers along with officers from the county law enforcement agencies met at the Aberdeen Eagles to participate the annual “Shop with a Cop” program. The program was set 14 years ago to help provide presents for under privileged children in the local communities. Officers paired up with children from their cities who had been picked by the schools they attend. Each child was given a \$100 gift card to buy presents from themselves or family members. The children were driven in a convoy of police vehicles to Wal-Mart to shop for their presents. A very good time was had by all and as always a positive interaction for the children and police officers.
- **On 12-16-12** at about 0500 hours, officers were dispatched to an apartment building in the 1600 block of Riverside Avenue reference a disorderly subject. Officers discovered a 42-year old Hoquiam man, who appeared to be highly intoxicated, had thrown a hard hat through his livingroom window. After he broke the window he started his chainsaw inside and revved it up several times causing concern from his neighbors. Officers discovered the man had a Montesano warrant for his arrest. The man was told he was under arrest; after a very short struggle, the man was taken into custody for resisting arrest and the warrant. He was booked into the county jail.
- **On 12-20-12** at about 0830 hours, the Hoquiam School District requested extra officers at the schools due to an alleged FaceBook posting threatening school violence in Aberdeen. A 16-year old Aberdeen male, who had been suspended from the Aberdeen High School, was suspected of posting the threat. Due to the high emotions from the recent incident in

Connecticut, officers were assigned to monitor the school district buildings during school hours.

- **On 12-21-12** at about 0830 hours, a 21-year old Taholah man, was arrested for trespass and resisting arrest after he tried to run from officers in the 100 block of West Chenault Avenue. Both the suspect and his 25-year old brother were ordered by the Hoquiam Municipal Court to stay out of Hoquiam unless they were attending court or seeking drug treatment. This order was issued by the court in response to the extensive and continual criminal history in Hoquiam by both suspects. The suspect was found hiding under a deck in a backyard and was booked into the county jail.
- **On 12-26-12** at 1330 hours, Officer Hergert saw a fax come into the department from the county jail stating a 60-year old male had been released from the jail with a court order keeping him away from his 52-year old wife, who lives in Hoquiam. Officer Hergert felt the male possibly would contact his wife (previously he had been arrested 3 times for the same offense). The woman said she had been receiving calls from her husband since shortly after 10 hours from a number in Montesano. A check of the number was from a tavern. Officer Hergert requested Montesano Police check the tavern for the suspect. The suspect was located and admitted to calling his wife. The suspect was arrested for the fourth time for violating the court order and again booked into the county jail.
- **On 12-27-12** at 0930 hours, Hoquiam officers went to an address in Moclips to serve arrest warrants on a 42-year old Hoquiam woman and 31-year old Moclips man. The warrants stemmed from a burglary to the Hoquiam Animal Shelter. The Grays Harbor Sheriff's Office assisted the officers. While attempting to serve the warrants the woman's pitbull attempted to attack a Hoquiam officer, who had to shoot the dog twice to protect himself from injury. The dog survived and was transported to a veterinarian in Hoquiam. The suspects were booked into the county jail on the warrants. The Grays Harbor Animal Control Officer is investigating the potentially dangerous dog case. The pitbull had previously been declared potentially dangerous in the City of Hoquiam.
- **On 12-29-12** at about 0925 hours, Sgt. Krohn arrived at the department firing range and discovered two males picking up spent shell casings and digging in the dirt for bullet lead. The 48 and 56-year old Hoquiam brothers admitted they saw the "no trespassing signs", but felt the brass was "free for the taking" since it was on the ground. The brothers are well known to law enforcement as metal thieves. The two will be submitted to the City Prosecutor for trespass and theft.

PERSONNEL:

- Sgt. Salstrom and Det. Blundred attended Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) training for youth at the CJTC Academy. This training is to help officers dealing with youth in crisis.
- Det. Blundred attended 40-hours of Domestic Violence training in Aberdeen.
- DC Wertanen attended a Communication course at CJTC. This training was to help managers and supervisors to deal with employee and citizen complaints.
- Officers completed low light firearms training. The training was developed to enhance officer's abilities to handle and fire weapons in low light and dark conditions. The training was held at the department range on two different days so both patrol teams could attend.
- Chaplain Sean Hollen has been with the department for 7 years this month. Chaplain Hollen provides a great service to the citizens of Hoquiam in the time of need.

FACILITIES/EQUIPMENT:

- Four new Glock handguns were purchased to be issued to the Police Services Officers once they are hired.
- Several items have been purchased for the new Dodge Durango so it can be fully outfitted as a patrol car once the department takes delivery of it.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 134 hours of service, which included residence and business checks. CRIME WATCH members also assisted with the Montesano Festival of Lights, Northwest Harvest Food Drive and Shop with a Cop.
- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of 123 hours, which was a combination of patrolling with officers and meetings. The explorers also participated in several events during the month such as, The Northwest Harvest Food Drive at Top Foods, Montesano Festival of Lights, HO HO Hoquiam and Shop with a Cop.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation.

The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases that were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
