MONTHLY REPORT FOR July 2012

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1356 law incidents for the month, issued 67 infractions, 30 criminal traffic citations, 17 criminal citations, 11 parking infractions and made 156 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled 89 “animal problem” complaints, 12 abandoned vehicles, 10 code enforcement issues and 12 parking complaints. A total of 51 animals were impounded.
- **WEEKEND JAIL SESSION #7 & #8:** On July 21st the jail opened for a 10 day session and closed on July 31st. During the jail opening a total of 49 persons were booked into the jail on a combination of warrants, court commitments and new charges. Ten females were booked and 39 males. During the court sessions of July 24th and 31st, a total of six persons turned themselves in on outstanding warrants which cleared 10 warrants from the court system. Five prisoners were able to post bail during the jail session and the court collect \$6,500. One female prisoner was released to seek emergent medical attention. One male arrested on new charges was referred to Behavioral Health Resources for evaluation and was eventually sent to a mental health facility for an involuntary commitment. During the July 24th court session, 20 prisoners were seen by the Judge. Nine of the prisoners were held on bail. After both court sessions, four prisoners were held on bail and sent to the Forks Jail to await a court appearance on 08-07-12. One male prisoner was sent to the Forks Jail to serve a 20-day sentence and one female was sent to Forks to serve a 90-day sentence for Driving While Suspended 1st Degree. This female had previously been sentenced to 90-days for the offense and was granted the opportunity to serve the sentence at home with electronic monitoring. The female slipped the monitor off and left home. She was arrested and sentenced to the original 90-day sentence. The female will be brought back to HMC on 08-07-12 to face a new escape charge. One male inmate was turned over to the Department of Corrections on an outstanding DOC felony warrant. A total of 78 warrants were cleared during this jail session.
- **On 07-04-12** at about 0900 hours, officers responded to suspicious activity at an old mill in the 800 block of Ontario Street. It was reported there was a male subject going in and out of the bushes near the old mill. Officers were aware of possible trespassing going on at the old mill for the past few days. Officers arrived and could hear noises coming from inside the metal building. Believing a burglary was in progress additional units were requested. Once a perimeter was set up entry was made. Three suspects were contacted in the metal building and arrested for Burglary 2nd degree. The suspects, a 42-year old Hoquiam man, 26-year old Copalis Crossing man and 34-year old Aberdeen woman all have prior history for metal theft and burglary.
- **On 07-06-12** at about 1113 hours, officers were dispatched to the YMCA parking lot reference a Vehicle Prowl complaint. A description of the suspect and vehicle (newer silver Lexus with dealer plates) was obtained. An Aberdeen officer heard the information on the radio and

recognized suspect. Sgt. Dayton was on patrol and located the suspect and vehicle at the convenience store on Lincoln Street. The suspect, a 33-year old Cosmopolis man was arrested for Vehicle Prowl and Theft 3rd. After further investigation the suspect was charged with Possession of Stolen Property because the Lexus he was driving was reported stolen from the Seattle area.

- **On 07-06-12** at about 2200 hours, Sgt. Strong was eastbound on Simpson approaching the intersection with two vehicles in front of him. The light was green for east bound traffic. The second vehicle in front of Sgt. Strong entered the intersection and was struck broadside by a Harbour Taxi van which had run the red light for northbound traffic. The vehicle, which was struck broadside, rolled completely over and came to rest on its wheels. The 50-year old Hoquiam taxi driver was transported to the hospital for minor injuries; he was also issued an infraction for fail to Stop at a Traffic Signal. The 45-year old Hoquiam woman was not injured.
- **On 07-06-12** at about 2253 hours, a 55-year old Lacey man was arrested for DUI after driving the wrong way on Simpson Avenue and striking the east end of the Simpson bridge causing his vehicle to roll onto its top. When the suspect was asked where he was headed when he struck the bridge, he explained he was trying to get back to Lacey. The suspect was processed for DUI. A 33-year old Roy woman, who was the passenger in the vehicle, was transported to the hospital with minor injuries.
- **On 07-07-12** at about 0230 hours, Hoquiam units were dispatched to a residence in the 400 block of Karr Avenue for an unknown problem. Dispatch advised a female was screaming on the telephone "They're trying to kill me". Officers arrived and learned two masked men had burst into the house, one with a baseball bat and the other with a handgun. The subject with the handgun held several of the occupants at gun point while the suspect with the baseball bat assaulted a 21-year old Hoquiam woman with the bat. This suspect also spray painted a tattoo on the victim's shoulder. The investigation revealed the attack was in retaliation for the victim getting the tattoo in memory of her fiancé who died in a vehicle accident in which she was the driver. Two suspects, a 34-year old Montesano man and 39-year old Aberdeen man, were developed and interviewed about the case. One suspect remains in custody for Burglary 1st degree and charges are still being reviewed by the Grays Harbor Prosecutor for the second suspect. Only the victim sustained injuries as a result of the assault; she was treated and released from the hospital.
- **On 07-10-12** at about 2100 hours, Officer McCartney saw foot and vehicle traffic at a house in the 900 block of Eklund Avenue, which had been reported as a location where illegal drug trafficking was taking place. During surveillance of the residence and traffic coming and going, he recognized a 53-year old Hoquiam man (who is a known drug dealer) leave the residence on a bicycle. At the same time a vehicle was seen leaving with two females inside. Using his vehicle MDT, Officer McCartney ran the vehicle plate and was able to obtain a driver's check using the registered owner. The female drivers' status was listed as Suspended in the 3rd Degree. Officer McCartney stopped the vehicle and verified the female's identity and arrested the 60-year old Aberdeen woman for Driving while License Suspended 3rd Degree. Officer McCartney received permission to search the vehicle. The passenger, a 36-year old Aberdeen woman was asked to step out of the vehicle. During the search, illegal narcotics (methamphetamine) were located next to the passenger seat. The female passenger admitted she had been given the drugs by her boyfriend at the residence who received them from the man on the bike. Later in the night the drug dealer was taken into custody and found to be in possession of more methamphetamine. This dealer identified his drug supplier, a 25 year old

Hoquiam man, whom officers have known to be involved with illegal drug trafficking. With this information Officer McCartney secured an arrest warrant for the suspect. On **07-12-12** officers set up surveillance on the suspect's vehicle and residence on Queets Avenue. The suspect and female left in a vehicle. He was stopped and taken into custody on the arrest warrant. During the search of the suspect and his vehicle, drugs, cash and digital scales were seized as evidence. The suspect's vehicle and cash have been placed into a civil seizure and could be forfeited if determined these items were illegal gains or instruments in the distribution of illegal narcotics. The suspect faces felony charges of Possession and Distribution of Illegal Drugs. The other two suspects face felony charges of Possession of Illegal Drugs. This was a fine example of police work by Officer McCartney in following leads to get a known drug dealer off the streets of Hoquiam.

- **On 07-13-12** at about 2100 hours, dispatch advised patrol units of a vehicle traveling the wrong way on Highway 12 from the Central Park area. About 15 minutes after the broadcast of the reckless vehicle, Officer Blodgett was traveling east bound on Industrial and saw a vehicle traveling west and appeared to be going faster than 30 MPH. The radar showed the vehicle speed at 48 MPH. Officer Blodgett also noted the vehicle matched the description of the reckless vehicle. Officer Blodgett turned on the, as he activated his overhead emergency lights. The driver started to pull over to the curb-then sped off. At this time Sgt. Salstrom was on Bay Avenue and saw the vehicle speed off. Both officers pursued the vehicle. Officer Blodgett attempted a Pursuit Intervention Technique to disable the vehicle, but was unsuccessful. The driver then headed the wrong way over the Simpson Avenue Bridge. At this time the pursuit was discontinued and officers went around to the downtown area to try and locate the vehicle. As the vehicle turned west onto 8th Street from Simpson, the pursuit was resumed. The driver drove out to Moon Island Road where the driver stopped and jumped from the vehicle and into the water in an attempt to get away. With the warning K-9 Enno would be released to capture him, the man swam back to shore and was taken into custody. The 32-year old Lakewood man was booked into the Grays Harbor County Jail for Felony Eluding a Police Vehicle.
- **On 07-14-12** at about 0300 hours, Officer Blodgett came across an abandoned vehicle in the 2800 block of Bay Avenue. It appeared this was a possible Hit and Run collision but the driver could not be located. Officers from Hoquiam and Aberdeen began to search the area on foot in an attempt to locate the occupant(s) of the vehicle to determine if anyone was injured, as blood had been located in the vehicle. An Aberdeen Officer advised he had been flagged down by a citizen who said there had been a fight in the 500 block of 28th Street. The Aberdeen Officer went to the location to see if this had anything to do with the vehicle collision. A short time later Hoquiam Officers were advised a 16-year old male was being detained as he had admitted to being in a fight and stabbing another subject in the leg who fled in the vehicle. Within a few moments the victim, a 22-year old Aberdeen man, was found unresponsive in the 2800 block alley between Pacific and Bay Avenues. Attempts were made by officers to resuscitate the victim until HFD Paramedics arrived on scene. The victim could not be revived. The suspect was detained for investigation of Homicide and taken to the police department. During the interview of the suspect he admitted to the fight and stabbing the victim. The suspect was later booked into the Grays Harbor Juvenile Facility for Homicide. There were three scenes to investigate by department personnel and the Total Station was used to map teach crime scene. All three scenes, evidence collection, mapping and suspect in custody were completed in approximately 15 hours. The department personnel involved did an outstanding job on this investigation and completed the initial investigation in an unusually short amount of time.

 - Chief Myers is currently working with the Department of Corrections on developing a contract to house DOC offenders for short term commitments. If this contract goes through, the Hoquiam Jail will be open on a full time basis which would be very beneficial not only for the housing of the DOC offenders, but it will provide a place to house offenders on Hoquiam charges instead of housing them in outside facilities. It is hoped the DOC contract revenue would cover the bulk of the needed 24/7 jail staffing cost.

PERSONNEL:

- On July 23rd through 27th, Sgt. Dayton and Sgt. Strong attended First Level Supervisor training at the Criminal Justice Training Center. The training is required by the state for officers promoted to a supervisory position. It is also a requirement for First Level Career Certification.
- Officers attended Defensive Tactics training this month held in the department training room. The class, taught by Master Defensive Instructor Cody Blodgett, helped improve the officer's ability to deal with situations in hand to hand confrontations with aggressive suspects. This training was held on two dates, July 25th and 27th, so both patrol teams could attend the training.
- Sgt. Brian Dayton celebrated his 13th year with the Hoquiam Police Department on July 1st.

FACILITIES/EQUIPMENT:

- The department has changed its uniform colors to an all solid dark navy blue. This change had become a necessity as the two tone blue shirts are limited supply. The officers like the new uniforms for their comfort and fit. We have also received positive feed back from the citizens of Hoquiam.
- The new security camera system has arrived at the department and installation will be completed in August. The installation will start in the jail area and move outward to the perimeter of the building.
- Several items have been purchased to give to local children (pencils, coloring books, tattoos and Halloween bags). These items all have safety tips for children. The items will be distributed at school functions and National Night Out.
- Electric door locks have been installed throughout the department's exterior and jail doors. The only door remaining for the updated lock system is the lobby door entering into the office area.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month of July, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 153 hours of service, which included 110 hours in residence and business checks. The CRIME WATCH members were also involved with the Hoquiam River Festival, Hoquiam Girl's Babe Ruth Tournament and preparation for National Night Out in August.
- For the month of July, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of 76.5 hours. The explorers were involved with riding along with officers on patrol, worked at the Hoquiam River Festival and the Hoquiam Girl's Babe Ruth Baseball Tournament at Gable Park. Det. Blundred is currently doing background checks on new applicants who applied to join the department explorer post.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.


The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases that were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
