MONTHLY REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2012

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1238 law incidents for the month, issued 54 infractions, 31 criminal traffic citations, 12 criminal citations, 11 parking infractions and made 110 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled 68 “animal problem” complaints, 22 abandoned vehicles, 7 code enforcement issues and 9 parking complaints. A total of 22 animals were impounded.
- **WEEKEND JAIL SESSION #11:** This jail session was set to start on 10-06-2012, but because of arrests made Friday evening the jail opened early on 10-05-2012 at 2000 hours. (The jail was manned by on-duty officers). During the jail opening, a total of 21 inmates were booked into jail on a combination of warrants, court commitments and new charges. Seven arrested were females; 14 were male. Two of the inmates booked served day jail or court commitments; four were arrested on new charges. Six inmates posted bail and were released pending their next court appearance. The court was able to collect \$7,200 in bail. Twelve inmates were taken to court on October 9th. Two male inmates were held on bail and transferred to the Forks Jail. Four subjects turned themselves in at court on outstanding warrants. A total of 26 warrants were cleared during this jail opening.
- **On 10-12-2012** at about 2220 hours, Hoquiam officers were dispatched to a vehicle vs. pedestrian accident in the 100 block of Lincoln Street. A 29-year old Montesano woman had been riding her bicycle and dropped her cell phone in the street. The bicyclist stopped to pick up the phone in the northbound lane and was struck by a 48-year old Hoquiam motorist. The bicyclist was visible to the driver due to darkness and dark clothing. The Montesano woman sustained minor injuries and was transported to the hospital for treatment. The Hoquiam motorist was issued an infraction for No Insurance.
- **On 10-17-2012** at about 2045 hours, Sgt. Dayton received an anonymous report of a marijuana grow in the in the 1900 block of Broadway Avenue. Over the next few days, Sgt. Dayton established probable cause to obtain a search warrant for the residence, which was granted. Hoquiam officers served the warrant and located growing marijuana in the garage and inside the residence. A 52-year old Hoquiam man and his 29-year old son were identified as being responsible for the marijuana. They claimed to have medical marijuana authorization. Sgt. Dayton did not find any proof the marijuana was being sold, but, eight small plants were removed and destroyed to bring the subjects into compliance. Sgt. Dayton advised the subjects he would be checking in the future to assure they remained in compliance.
- **On 10-19-2012** at about 0754 hours, Hoquiam officers were dispatched to the area of the 1000 block of Lincoln Street after receiving several reports of a woman walking naked down the street. Officers arrived and located a 58-year old Hoquiam woman who matched the description, although she was now clothed. Investigation revealed the woman had violated a court order by going to her sister’s residence. The female was transported to HPD where she

was processed for Violation of a Court Order; mental health was also contacted for an evaluation on her mental state. While at the jail, Chief Myers had asked the woman to step in the holding cell to await determination for where she was going to go for incarceration. The female turned and pushed Chief Myers who in turn defended himself by shoving her into the cell. The female has been charged with Indecent Exposure and Violation of a Court Order. She has a long history of mental illness and run-ins with area law enforcement.

- **On 10-19-2012** at about 1122 hours, Officer McCartney was on patrol in the 2800 block of Simpson Avenue and saw a male subject who he believed had a valid HMC warrant. Officer McCartney pulled over to wait for the subject to walk by, but instead saw him duck between houses on the north side of the street. Officer McCartney went around into the alley and saw several people milling about. Officer McCartney went to contact the subjects and one of the males fled into a neighboring yard. Officer McCartney followed and ordered the subject to the ground. Once the subject was detained he was asked his name. Sgt. Mitchell arrived and immediately identified the suspect as a 31-year old Aberdeen man from past contacts. The suspect was arrested for Providing False Information to Police, Trespass and a confirmed felony warrant from Lewis County.
- **On 10-20-2012** at about 2045 hours, Hoquiam Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 2800 block of Simpson Avenue for a Burglary complaint. The residents reported they had been away from home since the early morning hours and returned in the evening to find someone had forced open a second-story door. The investigation revealed the suspect(s) had stolen several hundred dollars in currency and coins from a safe and bucket in the master bedroom. Officers attempted to lift latent prints from several locations but nothing of evidentiary value was located. At this time there are no suspects.
- **On 10-20-2012** at about 0120 hours, Hoquiam Officers were dispatched to a Burglary in Progress in the 900 block of Alder Street. Officers learned the resident, heard loud banging at or near his frontdoor and got up to investigate. As he approached his front door, a side window next to the door shattered and a hand came inside and reached for the door knob. The door started to open and the homeowner said he threw his body weight against the door to slam it shut. The suspect was a male subject in a black hoodie. A search was conducted using Aberdeen's canine unit with negative results.

BUDGET:

- For the month of July, **205 hours** of overtime was expended for patrol as listed below:

PERSONNEL:

- Officer Gaddis attended Pre-Supervisor Training at CJTC. This course is required for all OIC's (Officer in Charge) to complete as they are in charge of the shift in the absence of a Sergeant.
- DC Wertanen attended a leadership course at CJTC, "Finding the Leader In You". The course was focused on communication and dealing with problem employees.
- Sgt. Dayton and Sgt. Salstrom attended a Public Information Officer course at the WSP Academy. This training was focused on information released to several types of media sources.
- Sgt. Strong and Officer Figg attended a Blood Splatter course in Lacey. This training was an introduction to identifying and using blood splatter during an investigation.
- Police Service Dog "Enno" has been diagnosed with a tumor behind his left eye. Enno will be going through radiation treatment to possibly treat or slow the swelling of the tumor. As of this time Enno has been taken out of service.
- The interview and background investigations have been started for six prospective Police Services Officers. The detectives are currently working on completing backgrounds prior to the polygraph and physiological tests.
- On October 26th Officers were at HHS handing out "Seatbelt Tickets". The students were able to later redeem these tickets at a school assembly for prizes. This was positive re-enforcement on the importance of wearing their seatbelts.

FACILITIES/EQUIPMENT:

- The new commercial washer and dryer have been purchased for the jail. These items were needed to handle the larger loads of laundry generated by the anticipated jail population when the jail is opened. This will be installed once the city electrician runs a new electrical service.
- The new PSO office has been completed and moved across the hall from where it had been. The office is larger and will accommodate the corrections staff. A new 42 inch monitor has been installed so the PSO's can view all the jail population and cameras around the station.
- Patrol vehicle 305, the present K-9 car, will be transformed back into a patrol vehicle by removing the canine carrier and replacing it with a prisoner partition and plastic backseat. If the canine program continues in the future the vehicle can easily be converted back.
- Sgt. Mitchell and Officer Peterson took part in a promotional event put on by the Chrysler Corporation to demonstrate their new line of police vehicles. Sgt. Mitchell maintains the department vehicle fleet and Officer Peterson is the department EVOC instructor. The city will go out to bid next month to get a jump on replacing a 2007 Ford Crown Victoria with high mileage and escalating mechanical issues.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 123.5 hours of service, which included residence and business checks.
- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of 265.5 hours. 121.5 hours were riding with officers on patrol. Bradley Keaton logged 113 hours with his continued help with the technical upgrades at the department.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases that were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
