MONTHLY REPORT for MAY 2013

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1288 law incidents for the month, issued 86 infractions, 19 criminal traffic citations, 21 criminal citations, 26 parking infractions and made 114 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled 88 “animal problem” complaints, 22 abandoned vehicles, 9 code enforcement issues and 55 parking complaints; 32 animals were impounded.
- **On 05-18-13** at about 1636 hours, Officer McCartney, along with members of his squad served a search warrant at an apartment complex in the 500 block of Emerson Avenue. This investigation stemmed from a search warrant which was served in April at the same complex. The warrant was served and illegal narcotics (methamphetamine), records and packaging materials were seized. The suspect, a 34-year old Hoquiam man was not located and the case has been sent to the county prosecutor’s office for review and filing of charges.
- **On 05-22-13**, during the evening shift briefing, officers were advised of a 49-year old Montesano man, who is a well-known drug trafficker, was possibly en route to the Hoquiam area with a substantial amount of heroin he had purchased in Tacoma. Officers located the man and a 22-year old Aberdeen woman in the 2500 block of Simpson Avenue. The man was arrested on a valid DOC warrant. The female attempted to conceal something and then shoved it in her mouth. It was discovered she tried to swallow an ounce of heroin. Officers were able to retrieve a half ounce, but the female managed to swallow the other half. The male was booked into the city jail on the DOC warrant. The female was booked into the City Jail after being treated at the hospital; she faces felony drug charges and resisting arrest.
- **On 05-27-13** at about 1055 hours, a 17-year old Hoquiam boy was hit by a pickup pulling a travel trailer driven by a 61-year old Shelton man. The boy was struck as he attempted to cross Simpson Avenue in the 2800 block. The juvenile was in a marked crosswalk when the collision occurred. The juvenile was transported to the hospital by HFD for treatment of injuries to his wrist and knee. The driver was issued an infraction for failing to yield to pedestrian in a crosswalk.
- **On 05-27-13** at about 2300 hours, officers were dispatched to a noise/disturbance in the 1400 block of Riverside. The investigation revealed a 36-year old Hoquiam man, who was highly intoxicated, had gone to a residence to fight another male over an ex-girlfriend. The intoxicated subject tried to attack the resident, who grabbed a machete and defended himself. The man continued his assault and was struck with a golf club. Even after being struck with two weapons, the male continued to be aggressive and struggled with officers when arrested. There was a superficial wound to the man’s rib cage but he declined treatment. The man was issued a citation for trespass and resisting arrest and later released from the City Jail.
- **On 05-28-13** at about 1142 hours, a maintenance man arrived for work at an apartment complex in the 2400 block of Bay Avenue. As he was walking up to an apartment, he was met

at the door by a male subject exiting a vacant apartment. When confronted the suspects said he was just leaving. The maintenance man attempted to stop the suspect, but he took off running. Through the investigation and description of the suspect, it was determined the he was a 26-year old Aberdeen transient (who had lived in the apartment several years ago). The suspect was later located by a store in the 2700 block of Simpson Avenue in Aberdeen; he was arrested for trespass and several Aberdeen Municipal Court warrants.

PERSONNEL:

- Officer Blodgett obtained his re-certification as a Master Defensive Tactics Instructor from CJTC. Officer Blodgett is instrumental in teaching officers defensive tactics as well as officers in other agencies throughout the county.
- The “Every 32 Minutes” program was held at the Hoquiam High School on May 8th and 9th. This program is presented every other year throughout the county high schools to drive home the dangers of drinking and driving. The program is a very powerful message which encompasses the entire student body and their parents. Several students were picked as actors, who are either “arrested” or “die” due alcohol related incidents, which statically happens every 32-minutes in our county. Several agencies, HFD, HPD, Life Flight and Target Zero Traffic Enforcement were involved in delivering the message and response to mock vehicle accidents.
- Sgt’s Krohn, Strong and Mitchell attended the Washington Homicide Investigator’s conference in Shelton on May 10th. The conference was a lessons-learned and analysis of high profile homicides which occurred throughout Washington during the year.
- DC Wertanen attended advanced fire investigation training in Leavenworth. During the training the students set up burn cells and calculated flame height, time to flashover, heat rate release and thermal dynamics. Once the fires were set and extinguished the basic class used the cells to determine how and why the fires started.
- Officers attended Driver Simulator Training at HPD this month. The training was to re-enforce decision making during high speed and normal driving situations. The simulator was loaned to HPD from CJTC. Several area agencies also attended the training.
- Det. Blundred and Officer Luce attended the Northwest Gang Conference in Spokane. The conference covered current gang activity and trends throughout Washington State. And the usual \$25 cost per student was covered by W.C.I.A. (city insurance).
- Three officers celebrated anniversaries this month with the department, Chief Myers 7-years, Sgt. Salstrom 12-years and Sgt. Mitchell 12-years.

FACILITY:

- The new natural gas line and double stack commercial gas clothes dryer were installed in the jail laundry. We are still waiting for a part to arrive so the commercial washer can be installed.
- Two computers were ordered to replace failing units for the investigations division and one in the jail.
- Several pieces of duty equipment had to be purchased and/or replaced for Sgt. Salstrom and Officer High which was either held as evidence or destroyed as a result of the standoff incident in April. The items replaced included a portable radio, extension microphone, bullet proof vest, and duty belt with accessories.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 132.5 hours of service, which included residence and business checks.
- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of 147.5 hours, which was a combination of patrolling with officers and meetings.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases which were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
