

MONTHLY REPORT for October 2013

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1253 law incidents for the month, issued 43 infractions, 16 criminal traffic citations, 16 criminal citations, 10 parking infractions and made 78 criminal arrests.
- During the month, Animal Control Officer Bob Hill handled 77 “animal problem” complaints, 24 abandoned vehicles, and 32 parking complaints; 19 animals were impounded.
- **On 10-08-13** at about 1547 hours Hoquiam Police and Fire personnel were dispatched to a Vehicle versus Pedestrian collision at 22nd and Simpson Avenue. The investigation showed a female had been crossing 22nd Street on Simpson on the north side of the street in a battery powered scooter. The female was crossing 22nd Street in the crosswalk and was struck by a semi-truck pulling dump-style trailer. The semi had been stopped at the stop sign at 22nd waiting to cross south bound. The semi started out from the stop sign and struck the female which swept her under the vehicle carriage causing massive injuries. Hoquiam Fire Department personnel attempted to treat the female but she was pronounced deceased at the scene. The driver, a 41-year old Raymond man, said he did not see the victim as she crossed the street in front of him and was not aware he had struck anything until after seeing the scooter lying in the street behind him through his side mirror. The female was identified as a 50-year old Hoquiam woman.
- **On 10-11-13** at 1220 hours, officers received a report of a male subject at an ATM located in the 700 block of Simpson Avenue waving “hundreds” of dollars around in the air. Officers arrived and located a 15-year old male juvenile near the ATM. When asked about the money the boy became nervous and said he had been using his grandmother’s ATM card then changed his story and said it belonged to his aunt. After questioning him further it was discovered he and his grandmother live in Arizona and had come to Hoquiam to visit his aunt who is terminally ill. The boy was transported to a residence in the 300 block of Eklund Avenue where the grandmother was contacted. It was discovered the boy had stolen his aunt’s debit card to get the cash. The grandmother said her grandson is currently on probation in Arizona for the same type of crime. Since the juvenile has no family other than his terminally ill aunt, he was turned over to grandmother as they were flying home the next day. The case will be forwarded to the juvenile’s Probation Officer in Arizona and to the Grays Harbor Juvenile Prosecutor for review.
- **On 10-14-13** at about 0753 hours, at a residence in the 2700 block of Sumner Avenue a girl was looking out her kitchen window and saw an unknown male subject exit their garage carrying her father’s chain saw. The girl said the man looked directly at her and continued to walk off with the saw. The girl yelled for her father who went outside in his bare feet to try and locate the subject. With the description given by the girl, officers believed it may be a known thief. A photo array was put together but the girl was unable to identify anyone. The case is still under investigation.

- **On 10-15-13** at about 0115 hours, Officer Peterson assisted APD with a Home Invasion Burglary and Attempted Vehicle Theft which had just occurred in the 1000 block of West Perry Street in Aberdeen. APD officers obtained a very good description of the suspect and what had been stolen. APD utilized their canine team and tracked to a residence in the 1000 block of Cushing Street. Containment was set up around the house and the occupants were ordered outside. Two males and one female exited. The victim identified one of the males, a 27-year old Aberdeen man, as the suspect. The residence was searched and the stolen property was recovered. The man was arrested and booked for Burglary.
- **On 10-16-13** at about 1058 hours, Det. Sgt. Krohn and Det. Blundred had received a tip of a stolen vehicle in the basement of an apartment building located in the 500 block of Emerson Avenue. There have been numerous vehicle thefts in the Grays Harbor County area lately and no leads had been developed until now. The detectives went to the location and contacted the manager and asked if they could look in the basement, permission was granted. Once in the basement the detectives located a partially dismantled Honda Prelude. The vehicle had been partially hidden by a false wall. The VIN number on the vehicle was ran through dispatch and it was determined it was indeed reported as stolen through APD. The 35-year old Hoquiam was brought to HPD and interviewed about the vehicle; the vehicle was impounded for the investigation. During the interview more information and possible suspects were developed. The man was released pending the conclusion of the investigation.
- **On 10-17-13** at about 1701 hours, officers were dispatched to an Assault complaint in the 2900 block of Simpson Avenue. A 32-year old Olympia man said he had been assaulted by a 40-year old Hoquiam man while stopped at a red light at 29th and Simpson Avenue. This all stemmed from a family dispute after the recent death of a family member who lived in Hoquiam. There had been an ongoing dispute over the deceased's property. Attempts have been made to contact the suspect but it appears he has been avoiding contact from officers. The case has been sent to the City Attorney for review and filing of the charge of Assault 4th Degree.
- **On 10-25-13** at about 1601 hours, officers were dispatched to the area of 23rd Street and Sumner Avenue for a report of a large dog attacking an 8-year old boy. Sgt. Slastrom arrived and jumped the fence into the backyard and saw the mastiff type dog had the boy by the head would not let go. In a shed type building a 15-year old girl was protecting a 3-year old girl by holding a rake in case the dog attacked them again. Sgt. Slastrom distracted the dog, but the dog started to charge after him. Sgt. Salstrom deployed his TASER which had a minimal effect. The dog charged again and Sgt. Salstrom had to resort to discharging his firearm. The dog was wounded and took refuge behind the shed. Sgt. Salstrom was able to get all three juveniles out of the yard for treatment by HFD personnel. All three juveniles were treated at the hospital for their injuries which were severe. The dog was eventually put down by employees from the Rain Tree Veterinary office.

- For the month, **203.5 hours** of overtime was expended for patrol as listed below:

PERSONNEL:

- An entry level Police Services Officer test was given on 10-26-13. After the written test and physical agility test was completed we have 12 applicants set for oral boards on November 9th and 10th. Once the oral boards are completed we will begin the background investigations on the top three candidates.
- CRIME WATCH volunteers handed out candy for trick or treat at the 7th Street Theater on October 26th. The volunteers handed out candy to 406 children during the event. CRIME WATCH volunteers, Sgt. Krohn, Det. Blundred and Deputy Chief Wertanen also participated at the Trunk or Treat held at Central School on October 31st.
- Officer Gaddis participated in the annual DEA drug take back on October 26th. This event was sponsored by the Drug Enforcement Agency. People with unwanted/outdated prescription medication could drop off the medications at HPD for disposal at no charge. The medications are then shipped to the DEA for proper disposal. Officer Gaddis said 76 people took advantage of the service and turned in 166 pounds of medications for destruction.
- Officer High attended a 40-hour session for Crisis Intervention Training in Vancouver. The training helps officers develop techniques in dealing with people in crisis and who have mental illness issues.

FACILITY:

- The jail telephone system has been installed for the inmates of the City Jail. Having this telephone system will free up Police Services Officers for other duties other than giving each inmate phone call. The system has its own phone cards which can be purchased by the inmates at a cost of \$10 per card.
- The memorial for "ENNO" has been completed and placed in the yard behind the station where he used to take his breaks while on shift. CRIME WATCH had donated a dogwood tree for the area and Harbor Monument donated the monument in "ENNO's" memory.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of **140.5 hours** of service, which included residence and business checks. CRIME WATCH members provided security at the Hoquiam football games.
- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of **40 hours**, which was a combination of patrolling with officers and meetings.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases which were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
