

MONTHLY REPORT for October 2015

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1075 law incidents for the month, issued 61 infractions, 27 criminal traffic citations, 20 criminal citations, 4 parking infractions and made 72 criminal arrests.
- **On 10-09-15** at about 1929 hours, officers were dispatched to a business in the 3000 block of Simpson Avenue for a disorderly male subject. Officers contacted a 44-year old Aberdeen man who was standing next to his vehicle, wrapping duct tape around his legs. The male was making unintelligible comments as well as his pants didn't fit right and was using duct tape to hem them. Officers discovered the man had a HMC warrant for his arrest. Officers attempted to take him into custody, but he broke free and attempted to run. The man was tased and fell to the ground; he continued to resist and was tased again. The man was taken into custody for Resisting Arrest and the HMC warrant.
- **On 10-10-15** at about 1233 hours, officers responded to an APD Officer was requesting emergency traffic and additional units at a business in the 600 block of West Wishkah in Aberdeen. Hoquiam Officers discovered APD Officers struggling with a combative 35-year old Forks man in a motel room. The man had already been tased twice by APD Officers but was continuing to be combative and slipped out of his handcuffs; which now turned into a weapon he could swing against officers. The suspect was again tased and finally taken into custody. The suspect was transported to the hospital to have the taser probes removed and due his level of intoxication he needed to be medically cleared for incarceration. He was booked into the Aberdeen City jail on several charges. This is another example of HPD and APD working together.
- **On 10-12-15** at about 2121 hours, officers were dispatched to the abandoned mill in the 1000 block of Monroe Street for a suspicious circumstance call. The complainant reported they could hear banging coming from inside the mill. Officers entered and could clearly hear banging on metal. Officers crept up on the suspect, a 45-year old transient, who was hitting some metal with a crowbar. Officers announced their presence, the suspect turned with the crowbar in hand as if he was ready to swing it. Officers drew their service weapons and ordered the man to the ground, to which he complied. The man was taken into custody for Trespass 1st Degree and booked into the City Jail.
- **On 10-14-15** at about 0925 hours, Officer Hergert responded to a WSP Trooper following a suspected stolen vehicle through Aberdeen. Officer Hergert caught up to the Trooper as he and the suspected stolen vehicle crossed Myrtle Street in Hoquiam on Sumner Avenue. A high risk vehicle stop was initiated with the vehicle stopping near Ontario Street. The WSP Trooper and Officer Hergert ordered the suspect, a 45-year old Puyallup man, out of the vehicle at gunpoint. He was detained by WSP for the investigation of Possession of Stolen Property.
- **On 10-19-15** at about 1026 hours, officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Rayonier Avenue for Display of a Weapon call. It was reported a 24-year old Hoquiam man was threatening his

62-year old Grandmother and 58-year old Grandfather with a knife. Officers contacted the victims outside the residence and were told the suspect was still inside. Officer Hergert obtained the "Less than Lethal" bean bag launcher from his vehicle and Officer High was armed with a Taser. The suspect was located in the kitchen and ordered to lay on the floor; after being told several times he finally complied and was taken into custody. The suspect, who the grandparents described as having mental issues, was booked into the County Jail for two-counts of Domestic Violence Assault 2nd Degree.

- **On 10-19-15** at about 1127 hours, officers were dispatched to a business in the 800 block of Levee Street. It was reported a male subject was inside the business being disorderly and threatening employees. It was reported the suspect was last seen running towards 10th Street. The suspect, 29-year old Transient, was contacted at Levee and 10th Streets. He was obviously under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol as he was not making any sense as he spoke to the officers. Dispatch advised there was a valid DOC warrant for his arrest. Officers attempted to take him into custody; he fled on foot yelling "catch me if you can". A taser was deployed but only one probe struck the suspect. A foot chase ensued up the sidewalk on the Simpson Bridge. The suspect crossed the roadway and jumped off the side of the bridge; about 12 feet down to Simpson Avenue. Officers did indeed catch him and after a fight took him into custody for Resisting Arrest and DOC warrant. He was not injured from jumping off the bridge and was booked into the City Jail.

- For the month, **276 hours** of overtime was expended for patrol as listed below:

PERSONNEL:

- Jesus Martinez-Lopez started on October 5th as our newest Police Services Officer. PSO Martinez lives in Hoquiam and has family ties here. He was previously employed by the Department of Corrections as a Corrections Officer at Stafford Creek. He always wanted to work for the Hoquiam Police Department. His goal is to become a Patrol Officer with the department in the future. An application has been sent to CJTC for him to attend the January 2016 Corrections Officer Academy, until then he will be receiving on the job training with our current PSO's.
- Construction on the jail addition started on October 5th. The addition to the jail space has been needed for a long time. We are very excited the project is underway.
- Defensive Tactics training was held this month for department members to be re-certified in the use of impact weapons (collapsible baton and flashlights). The training was held on two-days so both patrol teams could attend. The course was instructed by Det. Blundred.

- Det. Blundred, Officer Hergert and Officer Spaur attended an 8-hour training session in Lacey this month. The class was on the investigation of butane hash oil Labs. This is a highly explosive method to extract THC from green marijuana. This method is extremely dangerous because of the volatile chemicals used in the process. This could become the next big drug manufacturing “craze” since the methamphetamine labs in the late 80’s and 90’s.
- Det. Pearson attended a 40-hour class for Homicide Investigation in Lakewood. This was required training for Det. Pearson after he was assigned to the Investigation Division. The class focused on different methods for investigating homicides. It also gave the students practical experience as they were given scenarios and had to follow protocols to reach a positive conclusion.
- Department members attended excellent training instructed by the PRISim Company. The training is computer generated Use of Force Simulator training which can be any type of scenario a law enforcement officer may be faced with. WCIA provided the training at no cost and it was held in the department training room.
- Department members and Crime Watch Volunteers participated once again in the annual “Trunk or Treat” event held at Central School. This is always a fun activity for the students and department members as well. Also attending were members from the community, HFD and parents of students. This year a total of 278 students received treats during the event.
- A Police Services Officer meeting was held on October 27th. The meeting held to discuss the upcoming jail expansion, issues in the jail and discussion on ways to save money on jail supplies and food for the inmates.
- Chief Myers and Sgt. Krohn participated in a Rail Road Haz-Mat table top exercise on October 27th which was held at the Pearsall building in Aberdeen. The Hoquiam and Aberdeen fire Departments, WSP, DOE , the Port of Grays Harbor, Grays Harbor Hospital and Rail Road Investigators also participated in the exercise.
- The new patrol vehicle, #304, is now in service. The vehicle was a WCIA replacement for the supervisor’s vehicle which was damaged beyond repair in the January 2015 flood and hill slide incident.
- Officer Wells has successfully completed his 1-year probationary period with the department. Officer Wells has been a great representative for the city and department. Officer Wells is very proactive and has become a valued asset and member of our department.

FACILITY:

- The department billed the Department of Corrections for 627 bed days during the month of October in the amount of \$53,295.00.
- The department billed the Ocean Shores Police Department for 8 bed days during the month of October in the amount of \$659.20.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of **116.75 hours** of service, which included residence and business checks. CRIME WATCH members provided security at the Hoquiam football games. They also participated in Trunk or Treat at Central School for Halloween.
- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of **78 hours**, which was a combination of patrolling with officers and meetings.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled "Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported" is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.


The second statistical report is a listing of "Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code". The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, "Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident" shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are "Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation" and "Total Offense Report, By Statute Description". The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of "arrests" made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases which were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
