MONTHLY REPORT for August 2016

POLICE ACTIVITY:

- The department handled 1211 law incidents for the month, issued 75 infractions, 28 criminal traffic citations, 20 criminal citations, 14 parking infractions and made 83 criminal arrests. ACO Taylor handled 32 animal complaints, 43 parking complaints, 21 abandoned vehicles and 3 code enforcement complaints. 22 animals were impounded during the month.
- **On 08-01-16** at about 1551 hours, officers responded to a domestic disturbance at a residence in the 2800 block of Sumner Avenue. The investigation revealed a 26-year old Hoquiam man had threatened his 57-year old father with a knife during an argument. The victim was not injured. The suspect was arrested for Domestic Violence Assault 2nd Degree and booked into the County Jail.
- **On 08-01-16** at about 1956 hours, officers responded to an apartment complex in the 2400 block of Bay Avenue. It was reported a 41-year old Hoquiam man was threatening to commit suicide with a firearm. Officers arrived and found the man inside his residence with a shotgun pointed at his head. The officers and a friend of the man were able to de-escalate the situation and convinced the man to put down the weapon. It was discovered the man was suffering from a degenerative disease which causes constant pain which prompted his suicide attempt. The man was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.
- **On 08-11-16** at about 2245 hours, officers were dispatched to a business in the 3100 block of Simpson Avenue reference a burglary in-progress. Officers arrived within minutes and located a hole cut in the chain link fencing. Officers also immediately spotted a male trying to hide behind a metal connex box inside the fenced area. The male ignored officer's instructions to come out of hiding and continued to look for a way to escape. The suspect, a 41-year old California man finally surrendered and was taken into custody. The man was booked into the County Jail for Burglary 2nd Degree; it was also discovered the man had an outstanding felony warrant from Eureka California for Burglary.
- **On 08-14-16** at about 1406 hours, officers were dispatched to a residence in 2500 block of Pacific Avenue for a threats complaint. The 16-year old female at the location said her ex-boyfriend was there threatening to assault her current boyfriend. An officer located the male juvenile close to the residence and was asked about the situation. The juvenile admitted to being at the house and his ex-girlfriend had come outside and yelled at him to leave at which time she fired a gun into the air. He felt it was time to leave then. Officer's contacted the juvenile female, who readily admitted she did fire the gun she had gotten from her mother's room to scare off her ex-boyfriend. This case was submitted to the Juvenile Prosecutor for review and filing of the charge of Unlawful Discharge of a Firearm.
- **On 08-15-16** at about 1524 hours, officers as well as HFD were dispatched to a gas station in the 200 block of Lincoln Street reference a hit and run pedestrian accident. Officers located a 54-year old Elma man lying near the gas pumps on the ground. He was able to explain he had

been walking back out to his vehicle when he was struck by a vehicle driven by a male subject and pinned between his vehicle and the suspect's. The suspect got out of his vehicle and told the victim he was fine. The suspect got in his vehicle and sped off north on Lincoln Street. With the information gathered from witnesses the suspect's identity was quickly determined. The suspect's residence was surrounded and the 66-year old Hoquiam man was instructed to come outside. After receiving no response additional units from Aberdeen P.D. and the Sheriff's Office responded to assist. A warrant was discovered issued from Pacific County for the suspect's arrest. The warrant was confirmed and just as officers were making entry to the residence the suspect came outside and was taken into custody. The man was booked into the County jail for Felony Hit and Run and DUI. The victim was treated and released from the hospital with minor injuries.

- **On 08-22-16** at about 1927 hours, HFD and HPD officers were dispatched to a structure fire in the 200 block of Eklund Avenue. Officers arrived and found several people standing outside the smoking residence. A 24-year old Hoquiam woman who lived in the house was suspected to have started the fire in her bedroom. The woman, who is well known to officers and suffers from mental illness, would not respond to any questions when asked what had happened. The fire was determined to have started in the woman's bedroom closet. It was also determined the fire was not accidental in nature. The woman was booked into the County Jail for Arson in the 1st Degree and will undergo a mental health evaluation.
- **On 08-23-16** at about 0940 hours, Chief Myers had been sitting in on HMC while it was in session. He noticed a male and female acting suspiciously during the proceedings. The 31-year old Elma man was arraigned for a Domestic Violence No Contact Order charge. After his arraignment he left. The next person, a 35-year old Elma woman with the same last name went before the judge. After the two left City Hall they were seen walking in the same direction towards the bus mall on 7th Street. Officers located the two together at the bus mall. It was verified the female was the protected party in a No Contact Order and the male was the respondent. The male was arrested and booked into the City Jail for this new violation, which was the same charge he had just appeared in court on.
- **On 08-25-16** at about 0028 hours, Officer Blundred was on patrol in the area of the 2400 and 2500 blocks of Aberdeen Avenue. He saw a female acting very suspiciously, walking around the area and looking in all directions as if she was looking or waiting for someone. Once the female saw officer Blundred she tried to hide in the shadows of a motel complex. Officer Blundred contacted the female who gave a very vague reason for her actions or what she was doing. He attempted to identify the female who gave him several fictitious names and dates of birth. The female finally identified herself as a 29-year old Tulalip woman. It was discovered the woman had a felony DOC warrant for her arrest which was confirmed. During a search of her property Officer Blundred found a loaded pistol in her backpack. During an interview she disclosed she was waiting for her boyfriend, a 26-year old Tacoma man. She also gave officers the make of the vehicle he was in. Her boyfriend was subsequently stopped by officers at a motel in the 2400 block of Aberdeen Avenue and arrested on a DOC warrant; he too was in possession of a firearm. Once the two complete their DOC obligations, they will both be booked into the County Jail for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.
- **On 08-28-16** at about 1907 hours, officers were dispatched to the area of the 28th Street boat launch. It was reported two intoxicated subjects were attempting to guide a boat into the dock. Officers arrived and located an intoxicated 29-year old Aberdeen woman standing in the middle of the gravel parking lot looking at the water. The officers saw the woman was looking at a vehicle stuck half way out on the dock teetering over the water. At first the woman said

her father had driven the vehicle there to get a better look at the sunset. When officers spoke with the woman's father. The female then admitted she had been the one to drive to its current location. The woman was arrested for DUI and taken to the City Jail for processing.

PERSONNEL:

- Department personnel, Crime Watch volunteers, Police Explorers, HFD personnel and City Administrator Brian Shay attended 13 neighborhood parties this year for National Night Out. Everyone had a good time and enjoyed getting out visiting with the citizens of Hoquiam.
- The Chief for a Day ceremony was held at the Criminal Justice Training Commission academy in Burien this month. During the ceremony Chief for a Day Evan Gentry along with 32-other little chiefs and sheriffs were sworn in along with having their badges pinned on by family members. During the celebration the little chiefs and sheriffs along with their families got to see many different displays and have pony rides at the academy. This is a very worthwhile event giving special needs children a very fun day and something to remember for a long time.
- This month department members participated in the annual "Top Gun" competition held at the department gun range. This is a timed course of 4-different scenarios set up by our firearms instructor to test the officer's abilities in the use of patrol rifles and sidearms. This year's "Top Gun" winner was Officer Figg with the best time and least amount of ammunition used to complete the course.
- Administrative Assistant Candi Wertanen celebrated 30 glorious years with the department this month.

JAIL:

- The department billed the Department of Corrections for 768 bed days for a total of \$65,280.00.
- The department billed Ocean Shores PD for 2 bed days for inmates in the amount of \$164.80
- The department billed the Cosmopolis PD for 2 bed days for inmates in the amount of \$170.00.

VOLUNTEERS:

- For the month, CRIME WATCH members volunteered a total of 116.25 hours of service, which included residence and business checks. A special thank you to Crime Watch Volunteer Karen Harp. Karen put in a lot of work in preparing for National Night Out by making prize boxes for the neighborhood parties with donated items from local businesses.

- For the month, the Hoquiam Police Explorer Post logged a total of 228.5 hours, which was a combination of patrolling with officers, meetings and National Night Out and assisted with security for the Macklemore/Ryan Lewis concert at the 7th Street Theater.

STATISTICAL REPORTS:

The following statistical reports encompass police activity for the month. The first statistical report titled “Law Incident Analysis, Time Reported” is a summary of each law incident by the day of the week and by the time of day.

The second statistical report is a listing of “Law Total Incident Report, by Location Code”. The three general areas of the city are designated by location codes: HPD Baker 6 is defined as the east end, HPD Baker 7 is the downtown area and west to the high school, and HPD Baker 8 is the north end of town from Emerson Avenue. Any location codes that are outside of the city were likely generated as a result of phone call requests to the station, traffic safety patrols or agency assists.

The third statistical report, “Total Law Incident Report, by Nature of Incident” shows the total for each of the basic law incident types handled by the department.

The final two monthly reports included in this packet are “Total Traffic Citation Report, by Violation” and “Total Offense Report, By Statute Description”. The first report lists the specific infraction or criminal charge and the number of violations issued under that charge. The second report is reflective of the number of “arrests” made under each statute. The two reports may overlap on some misdemeanor offenses if an arrest/booking was made followed by the issuance of a criminal citation. The second report captures felony arrests, but may not include misdemeanor or felony cases which were submitted to the prosecutor for review of charges (cases cleared without an arrest).
